

Presentation guidelines:

Contributed Papers: Contributed Papers present theoretical developments in the field of agricultural economics or sound applications of theory for the benefit of decision making in the public or private sector. Contributed Papers will be allocated to thematic sessions, with each paper receiving a 25 min slot (15 min talk and 10 min discussion). Presentations by PhD students will be embedded in the main Conference programme, and specific feedback will be provided for the presenters. The best PhD presenter will receive a £100 prize.

Discussion Papers: The intention of these sessions is to provide a platform for authors to present work that considers new ideas and approaches, addresses issues related to the more formative stages of a research project, or, more generally, provides the basis for wider discussion. Exceptionally, this year, each Discussion Paper will be allocated a 25 min slot (15-minute talk and 10 min discussion).
