

## **Report on 10th EAAE PhD Workshop at Corvinus University Budapest, Hungary.**

I attended the 10th EAAE (European Association of Agricultural Economics) PhD workshop from 5th to 7th June, held at Corvinus University, Budapest, Hungary. The workshop aims to provide PhD students with the opportunity to present their research in progress and to get feedback from peers and social economists. The main activities in the workshop included presentations from early career researchers, keynote speeches, and social events. It was my first time attending, and this was made possible through a grant from the Agricultural Economics Society (AES).

At the workshop, I presented my first research paper on Consumers' Attitudes and Willingness to Pay for Genetically Engineered Food in Nigeria. I received useful comments and feedback that will help improve my work and aid in the preparation of slides for subsequent presentations.

I also had the opportunity to meet other researchers from Europe working in the same field as me. Discussions with them allowed me to share my work and ideas and to learn from them. Presentations from researchers in other fields broadened my knowledge of Agricultural Economics. The social events provided an opportunity for me to relax and network.

The keynote sessions on publications by Jonathan Brooks and Iain Fraser provided me with vital information on the successes and failures of publishing a journal paper. I gained insights into the requirements for writing a good research paper, which will ultimately help in the publication of my research projects. Additionally, the keynote speech by Judith Fekete on grants and projects for early career researchers gave me an understanding of how to take advantage of available grants in Europe for my future projects.
